The City Administration monitors the budget closely throughout the year to ensure revenues and expenditures are within the amounts projected. Circumstances occur throughout the year that may cause one fund to be in excess of the amount anticipated, or to be less than what was anticipated.

An example of this would be the current year's Other Contractual Services line item (101-248-809). Due to the engagement of the consultant for the Citizens Advisory Committee, the City needed additional funds budgeted to this line item. Therefore, in order to keep the budget up-to-date, the City may transfer/supplement these funds. This process is often referred to as routine "housekeeping".

The proposed Supplemental Appropriation is necessary to revise the various City budgets for actual activity levels for fiscal year 2013-2014. The change is necessary in order to authorize additional levels of expenditures.



AGREEMENT FOR ELECTION SERVICES BETWEEN OAKLAND COUNTY AND CITY OF PLEASANT RIDGE

This Election Services Agreement (the "Agreement") is made between Oakland County, a Constitutional and Municipal Corporation, 1200 North Telegraph Road, Pontiac, Michigan 48341 ("County"), and the **City of Pleasant Ridge**, 23925 Woodward Ave., Pleasant Ridge, MI 48069 ("Municipality"). In this Agreement the County shall be represented by the Oakland County Clerk, in her official capacity as a Michigan Constitutional Officer. The County and the Municipality may also be referred to jointly as "Parties".

PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT. County and Municipality enter into this Agreement for the purpose of providing the Election Services pursuant to Michigan law.

In consideration of the mutual promises, obligations, representations, and assurances in this Agreement, the Parties agree to the following:

- <u>DEFINITIONS</u>. The following words and expressions used throughout this Agreement, whether used in the singular or plural, within or without quotation marks, or possessive or nonpossessive, shall be defined, read, and interpreted as follows.
 - Agreement means the terms and conditions of this Agreement and any other mutually agreed to written and executed modification, amendment, or addendum.
 - 1.2. <u>Claim</u> means any and all losses, complaints, demands for relief, damages, lawsuits, causes of action, proceedings, judgments, deficiencies, penalties, costs and expenses, including, but not limited to, reimbursement for reasonable attorney fees, witness fees, court costs, investigation, litigation expenses, amounts paid in settlement, and/or any other amount for which either Party becomes legally and/or contractually obligated to pay, whether direct, indirect, or consequential, whether based upon any alleged violation of the constitution (federal or state), any statute, rule, regulation, or the common law, whether in law or equity, tort, contract, or otherwise, and/or whether commenced or threatened.
 - 1.3. <u>County</u> means Oakland County, a Municipal and Constitutional Corporation including, but not limited to, all of its departments, divisions, the County Board of Commissioners, elected and appointed officials, directors, board members, council members, commissioners, authorities, committees, employees, agents, volunteers, and/or any such persons' successors.
 - 1.4. Day means any calendar day beginning at 12:00 a.m. and ending at 11:59 p.m.
 - 1.5. <u>Election Services</u> means the following individual Election Services provided by County Clerk's Elections Division, if applicable.
 - 1.5.1. Ballot Layout and Programming means preparing ballots and related programming so they may be read by electronic voting machines.

ELECTION SERVICES - INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT Page 1

1.6. <u>Exhibits</u> mean the following descriptions of Election Services which are governed by this Agreement only if they are attached to this Agreement and incorporated in Section 2 or added at a later date by a formal amendment to this Agreement.

1.6.1. Exhibit I: Ballot Layout and Programming.

- 1.7. <u>Flash Card</u> means a device that when inserted into the Voter Assist Terminal will enable the machine to properly mark a voter's ballot.
 - Local Clerk means the local elected or appointed Clerk for Municipality or their designee.
 - 1.9. Local Election Definition File means a computer program that reads the results from the tabulators in each voting machine and produces a report showing the totals for each precinct and the overall totals for each office, proposal or item voted on.
- 1.10. <u>Municipality or Municipal</u> means the City of Pleasant Ridge, a Municipal Corporation including, but not limited to, its Council, Board, any and all of its departments, its divisions, elected and appointed officials, directors, board members, council members, commissioners, authorities, committees, employees, agents, subcontractors, attorneys, volunteers, and/or any such persons' successors.
- 1.11. <u>Programming File</u> means a computer program that when placed on a card, will enable the tabulator to read and tabulate votes.
- 1.12. <u>Tabulator Cards</u> means a device that when inserted into a voting machine will enable the voting machine to properly read the markings made by voters on a ballot and then store these vote results.
- 1.13. <u>Voter Assist Terminal</u> means an optical scan ballot-marking device that provides voter privacy and accessibility to voters who are visually-impaired, or have physical impairments.
- 1.14. <u>Voter Assist Terminal Programming File</u> means a computer program that, when placed on a Flash Card, will enable the Voter Assist Terminal to function and properly mark a voter's ballot.
- <u>COUNTY RESPONSIBILITIES</u>. Through its County Clerk Elections Division County shall provide the Election Services described in Exhibit I which is attached and incorporated in to this Agreement.
- <u>MUNICIPALITY RESPONSIBILITIES</u>. Shall perform the responsibilities described in Exhibit I.

4. DURATION OF INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT.

4.1. The Agreement and any amendments hereto shall be effective when executed by both Parties with concurrent resolutions passed by the governing bodies of each Party. The approval and terms of this Agreement and any amendments hereto, except as specified below, shall be entered in the official minutes of the governing bodies of each Party. An executed copy of this Agreement and any amendments shall be filed by the County Clerk with the Secretary of State.

- 4.2. The Chairperson of the Oakland County Board of Commissioners is authorized to sign amendments to Agreements for the purpose of adding Service(s) Exhibit(s) that were previously approved by the Oakland County Board of Commissioners and defined in the executed Agreement but are requested by Municipality after they approved the Agreement. The amendment signed by the Board Chairperson under this Section must be sent to the Elections Division in the Clerk's Office to be filed with the Agreement once it has been signed by both Parties.
- 4.3. Unless extended by mutual, written agreement by both Parties, this Agreement shall remain in effect for five (5) years from the date the Agreement is completely executed by all Parties or until cancelled or terminated by any of the Parties pursuant to the termination or cancellation of the Agreement Section herein.
- 5. PAYMENTS. Municipality hereby agrees to pay to the County the following amounts:
 - 5.1. Election Services shall be provided to Municipality at the rates specified in the Exhibit(s).
 - 5.2. County, through its Department of Management and Budget, and upon such frequency as deemed appropriate by County, shall prepare and forward to the Municipality an itemized invoice for Election Services provided to the Municipality pursuant to this Agreement. Municipality agrees to pay the full amount shown on any such invoice within thirty (30) calendar days after the date shown on any such invoice. Payment shall be sent to the Oakland County Treasurer, 1200 N. Telegraph Road, Pontiac, Michigan 48341, along with a copy of the invoice.
 - 5.3. The Parties agree that Municipality's obligation to pay County any and all amounts due and owing under this Agreement shall be absolute and unconditional and shall not be affected, in any way, by the occurrence of either Party's default or any term or condition of this Agreement nor shall any other occurrence or event relieve, limit, or impair the obligation of Municipality to pay County as provided for herein. County shall seek payment from the governmental corporation and not from the personal assets of any individual included in the definition of Municipality.
 - 5.4. If Municipality fails, for any reason, to pay the County any monies when and as due under this Agreement, Municipality agrees that unless expressly prohibited by law. County or the County Treasurer, at their sole option, shall be entitled to setoff from any other Municipality funds that are in the County's possession for any reason. Funds include but are not limited to the Delinquent Tax Revolving Fund ("DTRF"). Any setoff or retention of funds by the County shall be deemed a voluntary assignment of the amount by the Municipality to the County. Municipality waives any Claims against the County or its Officials for any acts related specifically to the County's offsetting or retaining such amounts. This paragraph shall not limit Municipality's legal right to dispute whether the underlying amount retained by County was actually due and owing under this Agreement.
 - 5.5. If County chooses not to exercise its right to setoff or if any setoff is insufficient to fully pay County any amounts due and owing the County under this Agreement, County shall have the right to charge up to the then-maximum legal interest on any unpaid amount. Interest charges shall be in addition to any other amounts due to

County under this Agreement. Interest charges shall be calculated using the daily unpaid balance method and accumulate until all outstanding amounts and accumulated interest are fully paid.

5.6. Nothing in this Section shall operate to limit County's right to pursue or exercise any other legal rights or remedies under this Agreement against Municipality to secure reimbursement of amounts due the County under this Agreement. The remedies in this Section shall be available to the County on an ongoing and successive basis if Municipality at any time becomes delinquent in its payment. Notwithstanding any other term and condition in this Agreement, if County pursues any legal action in any court to secure its payment under this Agreement, Municipality agrees to pay all costs and expenses, including attorney's fees and court costs, incurred by County in the collection of any amount owed by Municipality.

6. ASSURANCES.

- Each Party shall be responsible for any Claims made against that Party and for the 6.1. acts of its officers or employees.
- 6.2. Except as provided for in Section 5.6, in any Claim that may arise from the performance of this Agreement, each Party shall seek its own legal representation and bear the costs associated with such representation including any judgments and attorney fees.
- 6.3. Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, neither Party shall have any right under any legal principle to be indemnified by the other Party or any of its officers or employees in connection with any Claim.
- This Agreement does not, and is not intended to, impair, divest, delegate or 6.4. contravene any constitutional, statutory, and/or other legal right, privilege, power, obligation, duty or immunity of the Parties. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as a waiver of governmental immunity for either Party.
- 6.5. The Parties have taken all actions and secured all approvals necessary to authorize and complete this Agreement. The persons signing this Agreement on behalf of each Party have legal authority to sign this Agreement and bind the Parties to the terms and conditions contained herein.
 - Each Party shall comply with all federal, state, and local ordinances, regulations. 6.6. administrative rules, and requirements applicable to its activities performed under this Agreement.
- 7. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY. In no event shall either Party be liable to the other Party or any other person, for any consequential, incidental, direct, indirect, special, and punitive or other damages arising out of this Agreement.
- 8. TERMINATION OR CANCELLATION OF AGREEMENT. Either Party may terminate or cancel this Agreement upon ninety (90) days written notice. if: (i) the other Party defaults in any obligation contained in this Agreement and within the ninety (90) day notice period the Party failed to cure such default or failed to take a course of action to cure such default or (ii) for any reason, including convenience. Any notification concerning default must be in writing and clearly state the specific default(s). The effective date of

termination and/or cancellation shall be clearly stated in the written notice. Either the County Clerk or the Board of Commissioners is authorized to terminate this Agreement for the County.

- <u>DELEGATION OR ASSIGNMENT</u>. Neither Party shall delegate or assign any obligations or rights under the Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party.
- 10. <u>PRECEDENCE OF DOCUMENTS</u>. In the event of a conflict between the terms and conditions of any of the documents that comprise this Agreement, the terms in the Agreement shall prevail and take precedence over any allegedly conflicting terms in the Exhibits or other documents that comprise this Agreement.
- 11. FORCE MAJEURE. Notwithstanding any other term or provision of this Agreement, neither Party shall be liable to the other for any failure of performance hereunder if such failure is due to any cause beyond the reasonable control of that Party and that Party cannot reasonably accommodate or mitigate the effects of any such cause. Such cause shall include, without limitation, acts of God, fire, explosion, vandalism, any law, order, regulation, direction, action, or request of the United States government or of any other government, national emergencies, insurrections, riots, wars, strikes, lockouts, work stoppages, or other labor difficulties. Reasonable notice shall be given to the affected Party of any such event.
- 12. <u>NOTICES</u>. Notices given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be personally delivered, sent by express delivery service, certified mail, or first class U.S. mail postage prepaid, and addressed to the person listed below. Notice will be deemed given on the date when one of the following first occur: (1) the date of actual receipt; (2) the next business day when notice is sent express delivery service or personal delivery; or (3) three days after mailing first class or certified U.S. mail.
 - 12.1. If Notice is sent to the County, it shall be addressed and sent to: Oakland County Clerk, 1200 North Telegraph Road, Pontiac, Michigan, 48341 and the Chairperson of the Oakland County Board of Commissioners, 1200 North Telegraph Road, Pontiac, Michigan 48341.
 - If Notice is sent to the Municipality, it shall be addressed to: The Clerk, City of Pleasant Ridge, 23925 Woodward Ave., Pleasant Ridge, MI 48069.
 - 12.3. Either Party may change the address and/or individual to which Notice is sent by notifying the other Party in writing of the change.
- 13. <u>GOVERNING LAW/CONSENT TO JURISDICTION AND VENUE</u>. This Agreement shall be governed, interpreted, and enforced by the laws of the State of Michigan. Except as otherwise required by law or court rule, any action brought to enforce, interpret, or decide any Claim arising under or related to this Agreement shall be brought in the 6th Judicial Circuit Court of the State of Michigan, the 50th District Court of the State of Michigan, or the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Michigan, Southern Division, as dictated by the applicable jurisdiction of the court. Except as otherwise required by law or court rule, venue is proper in the courts set forth above.
- ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement represents the entire agreement and understanding between the Parties. This Agreement supersedes all other oral or written

agreements between the Parties. The language of this Agreement shall be construed as a whole according to its fair meaning, and not construed strictly for or against any Party.

EXHIBIT I

BALLOT LAYOUT AND PROGRAMMING

1. COUNTY RESPONSIBILITIES.

- 1.1. The County shall provide an electronic version of the ballot for each precinct, as approved by the Local Clerk, to the ballot printing vendor selected by County for elections pertaining to statewide and/or County elections. For elections that solely pertain to Municipal offices or issues, the County will provide an electronic version to the ballot printing vendor it has selected unless the Municipality indicates in writing to County that it has selected a different vendor approved by the voting equipment manufacturer.
- 1.2. The County shall provide the Municipality with a Local Election Definition File, Voter Assist Terminal Programming File and Programming File.
- The County shall program the Tabulator Cards for each voting machine and, if requested by the Municipality, Flash Cards for each Voter Assist Terminal.
- 1.4. County shall mail a Phonetic Verification Form to every local candidate (excluding precinct delegates) prior to each election requesting a phonetic spelling of each candidate's name as it will be used on the ballot used with the Voter Assist Terminal unless the Local Clerk has the candidate complete the Phonetic Verification Form and provides a copy of the Form to County.

2. MUNICIPALITY RESPONSIBILITIES.

- 2.1. No later than eighty (80) days prior to each election in which there are County. Statewide or Municipal issues to be voted upon, the Local Clerk shall complete and return to the County:
 - 2.1.1. The Pre-Election Questionnaire prepared by County.
 - 2.1.2. A listing or verification of a listing, per precinct of each office to be elected on the form provided by County.
 - Notification of any boundary changes made by Municipality since the previous election.
- 2.2. Within three (3) business days of receipt from the County of an electronic version of the ballots for each Municipal precinct, advise the County of any corrections that are needed for any of the precinct ballots. This process will continue until a final version of the ballot is approved by the Local Clerk.
- 2.3. Once a final version of the ballots are approved by the Local Clerk, the Local Clerk shall immediately complete and return to County the Ballot Layout Sign-Off Form provided by County.
- Municipality shall pay to the County an amount equal to THREE HUNDRED (\$300.00) DOLLARS for each election.

RE: Citizens Advisory Committee



In December, the City Commission had a discussion about starting a committee to look at the City budget and if an additional millage question/vote would be necessary in November.

By mid-December the City started accepting applications to sit on a Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) to complete this task.

A large push was made so residents had information about what the committee's purpose was, and that there would be a significant time commitment involved. This included an on-line application, Ridger coverage, Facebook, signs at 4 Ridge and City Hall & word of mouth.

I was pleased that we received 49 applications (3 had to withdraw because of schedule). The pool of applicants was very diverse, and represented a cross section of the City.

As the City Commission continued discussions about the formulation and function of the committee, it was decided that a facilitator from outside of our Pleasant Ridge circle would be the best option for the committee. As you recall, Mr. Zech was unable to accept the Interim City Manager position due to personal commitments. The City Commission directed the Administration to inquire if Mr. Zech would consider facilitating this new committee and assist with the group. He agreed to the terms presented to him and the City entered into a contract for his services. The City Commission and staff have met with Mr. Zech a number of times to work out the details and overall function of the committee. From those meetings a schedule and mission statement was established, they are below:

SCHEDULE

The CAC will meet the second and fourth Thursday of February, March, April, May and June.

Feb. 13 & 27
March 13 & 27
April 10 & 24
May 8 & 22
June 12 & 26 (if needed)

The mission statement was created by Mr. Zech with input from the City Commission and staff. It is as follows:

The Pleasant Ridge Mayor and City Commission have established a Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) to assist them with conducting a thorough review of the City's financial position. The fifteen member CAC will examine the City's current and future revenues and expenses, past cost cutting efforts, and future spending needs. Once this has been accomplished, the CAC will make recommendations as to whether a Headlee Override Proposal should be put before the voters or which areas or services should be reduced or both.

The deadline to submit an application for the CAC was February 3, 2014. At that time each City Commissioner ranked their 15 choices independently, and submitted them to the administration. I complied those results so the selection process could begin at a workshop held February 6.

All the applications were reviewed and discussed in detail by the City Commission, Administration & Committee facilitator at the February 6th workshop. As a group, we came to a consensus of the 15 applicants and 2 alternates that would be recommended to the City Commission for appointment. The 15 applicants and two alternates I am recommending are:

The selection process was a difficult. It included a great deal of discussion about all the applicants. Mr. Zech also reviewed all the applicants and stated, "First and foremost, I was struck by the number and quality of the residents that wish to serve on the CAC. If I were an elected official of the City of Pleasant Ridge, I would consider that to be a very good sign."

I feel optimistic about the CAC and believe it will serve the community in a positive way, along with Mr. Zech's perspective on the budget and committee process.

Therefore, I recommend the establishment of a Citizens Advisory Committee for the City of Pleasant Ridge to carry out the goals of their mission statement. Further, I recommend the following 15 residents and 2 alternates be appointment to the CAC,

Concert-in-the-Park update

Mr. Pietrzak included in our packet a report of all revenues and expenditures associated with the September 2013 DDA Concert-in-the Park. The concerts historically do not turn a profit or break even, because of the costs involved with the entertainment and dinners that are not sold. The sale of wine does help recoup a portion of the overall cost, but not enough.

When the Concert Series was started in 2006, the goal was to allow the DDA to bring attention to the landscape and design of the District and allow Authority members and residents an opportunity to meet and welcome our business community and residents. The goal has never been to raise funds or a profit making venture.

He shared some ideas for next year's series that may offer an opportunity to close the revenue/expenditure gap, and possibly allow the DDA to offer additional events/programs. Those ideas included adding beer to the menu, changing bands/entertainment, outsourcing meal options to a food truck at no up-front cost to the DDA, and having a local business sponsorship.

Other Business

Commissioner Schlesinger wanted any cancellation of the DDA meetings to follow a formal process. She feels that in the past we are notified 2-3 days before and wants something better. Chairman Bolach stated that the City Manger and the Chairman jointly decide if there is anything of merit to review and then make the cancellation/rescheduling decision. He indicated that there could be more advance notice of this going forward.

Mayor Metzger asked how businesses could be engage more in the DDA. Commissioner Laidlaw indicated that in the past business were contacted door to door by Commissioners Lenko and O'Brien with little success. Commissioner Decoster stated the DDA was to include information in the Ridger and that was overlooked previously. Commissioner Laidlaw also pointed out that since the businesses are not always the owner of the real estate that participation/contact//engagement has been harder as well. Commissioner Perry added that using the Ridger would be valuable going forward.

Master Plan Update

She indicated that the Master Plan is still in its infancy, and will have many opportunities for community wide input. Beckett & Raeder and the Administration recommend the Planning Commission host a community visioning session for the Community Master Plan. This session would convene at 4 Ridge in January or February on a non-Planning Commission evening. Sessions usually last approximately 2 ½ hours, and Beckett & Raeder will provide a facilitator to maximize the benefit of this session. Mr. Iacoangeli has 4 individuals in his firm who are National Charette Institute (NCI) certified.

Commissioner Schlesinger asked if additional sections such as land use, action plan, zoning recommendations, etc. could be added and DuMouchel confirmed yes. Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) update

Mr. Pietrzak updated the commission on the ADU Committee. There have been two workshops/ meetings, including one this evening. They will have a summary of their progress to date at the meeting. A draft ordinance should be available at the next Planning Commission meeting for review by the entire commission. By February or March the ordinance should be available for city commission review.

Parking Committee update

Mr. Pietrzak indicated that the city has received some updated plans from Mr. Pearlman, Field's, and his architect. He suggested the parking committee schedule a sub-committee meeting in the near future. Decoster thinks the changes could be reviewed by the whole commission. Schlesinger asked if Field's was part of the overall parking committee consideration and Decoster confirmed yes. He added that the ordinance appears to be properly written as of today Stearn asked if things like handicapped parking and striping could be done quickly and implemented sooner than sweeping changes. Pietrzak said that was how the city was reviewing things, specifically with Field's, at this time.

Transit update

Commissioner Decoster provided and update on WA3/SEMCOG. The studies are essentially done at this point until the alternative analysis is completed. He said that issues regarding 696/Woodward are probably a long-term vision. He wanted everyone to be aware of the December 11th meeting involving SEMCOG at Coolidge Intermediate School.

City Commissioner Perry added that public comments continue to come in and that rapid transit is the focus. Feeder options to connect to the rapid system are being reviewed as well. Decoster said that an inner lane vs. outer lane and where the system would stop in Pleasant Ridge should be the Planning Commission's focus. City Commissioner Perry added that most cities are providing their own recommendations. Mr. Pietrzak will draft some ideas for consideration at future meetings.

Commissioner Decoster wanted to know of MDOT will paint zebra striping at the Devonshire to 696 triangle. Mr. Pietrzak to follow up with them on this. Commissioner Decoster also suggested we schedule a meeting with MDOT to review the Master Plan.

Other Business

Resident Rob Saket, 8 Fairwood, brought up parking issue concerns on both Sylvan and Fairwood. He asked about enforcement of current ordinances and suggestions by the Planning Commission to fix problems going forward. Bolach wanted him to now that the commission has no authority to enforce and the city manager and the police need to address this. Saket is very concerned about garbage and rat problems, both at Cork and behind the condos at Maywood.

Mr. Pietrzak indicated that letters could sent out to the businesses regarding enforcement of ordinances.
