Dogs and the Leash Law

Recently there has been discussion at City Commission meetings and a Town Hall meeting regarding dogs running loose and/or walking with their owners not on a leash. A proposed "DANGEROUS DOG" ordinance has also been discussed.

As a result of that process, the city will make enforcement of the existing leash law a higher priority. The ordinance regarding dogs running at large can be found on the city website, in the Code of Ordinances.

The existing ordinance is as follows:
CHAPTER 10 - ANIMALS, ARTICLE II, Sec 10-43:
Running at large prohibited

"It shall be unlawful for any person to suffer, cause or permit any dog owned or possessed, kept, or harbored him/her to run at large. Any dog not kept upon or within the limits of the premises of the owner or possessor of the dog, shall deemed to be running at large, unless the dog is securely held upon a leash of sufficient strength to hold the dog, or in an enclosed automobile or other vehicle or shipping receptacle."

With this in mind, the Pleasant Ridge Police Dept. will enforce this existing ordinance when it is either observed by officers or we are made aware by concerned citizens.

To report an off-leash dog, call 248-541-2900 and select 1 to be connected to Police dispatch.

Please remember this ordinance is not written to punish anyone, but rather to ensure the safety of our residents, visitors and our pets.

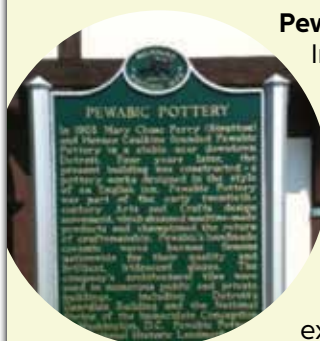


Sinbad's on the River

FERNDALE SCHOOLS

It is a great time to be an Eagle! Pleasant Ridge and Ferndale Schools have been partnering for the betterment of the students of Ferndale Schools and the residents of Pleasant Ridge. Next year, Roosevelt Elementary will house all the district's K-2 students. This is part of our district restructuring plan that focuses on Achievement, Sustainability, and Equity. Our Ferndale Elementary Lower Campus (at Roosevelt) will combine the historical benefits of the Open Classroom philosophy with Cambridge International curriculum and educational best practices. This new campus will offer a special environment that fosters the unique quality of our Pleasant Ridge and Ferndale community.

One aspect of this partnership with Pleasant Ridge is the design and installation of a new handicap accessible playground on the former basketball courts off Ridge Road at the Lower Campus (Roosevelt). In working with the City of Pleasant Ridge, we determined that our handicapped students and neighboring residents did not have an accessible playground. It's very important to everyone for our disabled students to be able to play with their classmates, and the new addition will allow for more inclusive play. The City Commission of Pleasant Ridge voted to purchase a piece of equipment to enhance this playground for Roosevelt students and all of the residents of Pleasant Ridge.

The success of the City of Pleasant Ridge and the Ferndale Schools are intertwined. It is these types of partnerships that will make both organizations stronger and better for the residents of Pleasant Ridge and the students of Ferndale Schools.

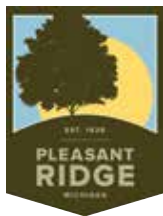
