

GET OUT AND VOTE

Election Day is Tuesday, November 7, 2023

Vote at the PR Community Center, 4 Ridge Road. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Tuesday, November 7, 2023 -General Election

Close of Registration for the November Election is Mon., Oct. 23, 2023, for any manner other than in person at the City Clerk's office. In-person registration at the City Clerk's office will be Tue., Oct. 24 thru Tue., Nov. 7, 2023, with appropriate proof of residency.

If you are unable to vote in person, you may apply for an Absentee Ballot by contacting the City Clerk's Office at (248) 541-2901 or cityclerk @cityofpleasantridge.org or request one online at www.mi.gov/vote.

The polls will be open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. All Pleasant Ridge residents vote at the Pleasant Ridge Community Center.

Election inspectors will be available to answer any questions you may have on Election Day.

Early voting will be offered for 9 consecutive days, beginning on Sat., Oct. 28 thru Sun., Nov. 5. More information regarding early voting locations and hours to follow on the City website and through an eBlast email.

Please bring your ID to the polls. Acceptable forms of photo ID include:

- Valid driver's license
- Federal or State ID with photo
- U.S. Passport

- Current high school or college student photo ID
- Military ID with photo
- Tribal ID with photo

If the voter states they have no valid form identification with photo, they may obtain a ballot by completing and signing an affidavit and voting a regular ballot anyway. If you have any questions, please feel free to call the City

Clerk's Office.

Absentee Ballot Information

An Absentee Ballot can be mailed to your home, or any other address.

Absentee Ballot applications are available to Pleasant Ridge registered voters. You must fill out an application for each and every election before a ballot can be mailed to you.

The form can be picked up at the Clerk's office, requested by telephone, or in writing. When you receive the Absentee Ballot application, simply fill out the information. Return the form by mail, or in person. The ballot will be mailed to you at the appropriate time.

Voters who want to automatically be mailed a ballot for all future elections may sign up for the Permanent Absentee Voter List anytime at MI.gov/vote or when submitting an Absent Voter Ballot Application. Please call City Hall with any questions.

2023 Fall Leaf Pickup

Leaf pickup alternates between sides of the City each week. Cambridge East (between Ridge and Woodward) and Woodward Heights are picked up each week due to the large volume of leaves and traffic on those streets. The side of the City that is picked up first alternates each year, as well. This year we are starting on the East Side. *If all leaves are picked up from one side of the City early in the week, Brilar may move on and pick up some leaves from the other side of the City. If you live on the non-scheduled side of the City and Brilar does a supplemental pickup, don't worry, they will be back the following week as scheduled.*

Fall Weather and Schedule Adjustments In the event of unpredictable fall weather that impacts the pickup schedule, updates will be posted to the website.

Will We Extend Leaf Collection? No. As we get into December the risk of significant snowfall greatly increases. If leaves are still out on the street and it snows, we may not be able to pick up the leaves and will have to plow them back onto the lawn creating a mess. Based on experience from past years we will not extend the leaf pickup schedule. You can place leaves in yard waste bags at the curb on for compost pickup on trash days until December 11.

2023 Collection Schedule

Week of October 30: West Side + Woodward Heights Week of November 6: East Side + Cambridge East Week of November 13: West Side + Woodward Heights Week of November 20: East Side + Cambridge East



Week of November 27*: Final pickup begins starting with the West Side *pickup will continue into the following week if necessary until *all* streets have been picked up.

Leaf collection is a major task, as we generate more leaves per capita than any other nearby community. We ask for your cooperation to ensure that the process is as smooth and efficient as possible. The best thing you can do to help us is ensure that only leaves are placed at the curb, and that cars are not parked on the street during the day until the leaves are picked up during your pickup week. Helpful Info from the PR Police

Four Signs It's a Scam

Recognizing these common signs of a scam could help you avoid one.

1. Scammers PRETEND to be from an organization

you know. Scammers often pretend to be contacting you on behalf of the government. They might use a real name, like the FTC, Social Security Administration, IRS, or Medicare, or make up a name that sounds official. Some pretend to be from a business you know, like a utility company, a tech company, or even a charity asking for donations. They use technology to change the phone number that appears on your caller ID. So the name and number you see might not be real.

2. Scammers say there's a PROBLEM or a PRIZE.

They might say you're in trouble with the government. Or you owe money. Or someone in your family had an emergency. Or that there's a virus on your computer. Some scammers say there's a problem with one of your accounts and that you need to verify some information. Others will lie and say you won money in a lottery or sweepstakes but have to pay a fee to get it.

3. Scammers PRESSURE you to act immediately.

Scammers want you to act before you have time to think. If you're on the phone, they might tell you not to hang up so you can't check out their story. They might threaten to arrest you, sue you, take away your driver's or business license, or deport you. They might say your computer is about to be corrupted.

4. Scammers tell you to PAY in a specific way.

They often insist that you can only pay by using cryptocurrency, wiring money through a company like MoneyGram or Western Union, using a payment app, or putting money on a gift card and then giving them the numbers on the back of the card. Some will send you a check (that will later turn out to be fake), then tell you to deposit it and send them money.

How to Avoid a Scam

• Block unwanted calls and text messages.

• Don't give your personal or financial information in response to a request that you didn't expect.

• Resist the pressure to act immediately. Honest businesses will give you time to make a decision. Anyone who pressures you to pay or give them your personal information is a scammer.

• Know how scammers tell you to pay. Never pay someone who insists that you can only pay with cryptocurrency, a wire transfer service like Western Union or MoneyGram, a payment app, or a gift card. And never deposit a check and send money back to someone.

• Stop and talk to someone you trust. Before you do anything else, tell someone – a friend, a family member, a neighbor – what happened. Talking about it could help you realize it's a scam.
