

# Election Day is Tuesday, November 8, 2022

Vote at the PR Community Center, 4 Ridge Road. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

# Tuesday, November 8, 2022 - General Election

Close of Registration for the November Election is Monday, October 24, 2022, for any manner other than in person at the City Clerks office. In-person registration at the City Clerk's office will be Tuesday October 25 through Tuesday, November 8, 2022, with appropriate proof of residency.

If you are unable to vote in person, you may apply for an Absentee Ballot by contacting the City Clerk's Office at (248) 541-2901 or cityclerk @cityofpleasantridge.org or request one online at www.mi.gov/vote.

The polls will be open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. All Pleasant Ridge residents vote at the Pleasant Ridge Community Center. Election inspectors will be available to answer any questions you may have on Election Day.

#### Please bring your ID to the polls. Acceptable forms of photo ID include:

- Valid driver's license
- Federal or State ID with photo
- U.S. Passport
- Current high school or college student photo ID
- Military ID with photo
- Tribal ID with photo

If the voter states they have no valid form identification with photo, they may obtain a ballot by completing and signing an affidavit and voting a regular ballot anyway. If you have any questions, please feel free to call the City Clerk's Office.

#### **Absentee Ballot Information**

An Absentee Ballot can be mailed to your home, or any other address.

Absentee Ballot applications are available to Pleasant Ridge registered voters. You must fill out an application for each and every election before a ballot can be mailed to you.

The form can be picked up at the Clerk's office, requested by telephone, or in writing. When you receive the Absentee Ballot application, simply fill

out the information. Return the form by mail, or in person. The ballot will be mailed to you at the appropriate time.

If you wish to receive an Absentee Ballot application automatically, you must contact the City Offices. Being placed on the permanent absentee voter's list will ensure that you receive an absentee voter's application for each election. It is Michigan Election law that you complete a new application for each ballot you receive. Please call City Hall with any questions.

# 2022 Fall Leaf Pickup

Leaf pickup alternates between sides of the City each week. Cambridge East (between Ridge and Woodward) and Woodward Heights are picked up each week due to the large volume of leaves and traffic on those streets. The side of the City that is picked up first alternates each year, as well. This year we are starting on the East Side. If all leaves are picked up from one side of the City early in the week, Brilar may move on and pick up some leaves from the other side of the City. If you live on the non-scheduled side of the City and Brilar does a supplemental pickup, don't worry, they will be back the following week as scheduled.

*Fall Weather and Schedule Adjustments* In the event of unpredictable fall weather that impacts the pickup schedule, updates will be posted to the website.

**Will We Extend Leaf Collection?** No. As we get into December the risk of significant snowfall greatly increases. If leaves are still out on the street and it snows, we may not be able to pick up the leaves and will have to plow them back onto the lawn creating a mess. Based on experience from past years we will not extend the leaf pickup schedule. You can place leaves in yard waste bags at the curb on for compost pickup on trash days until December 13.



#### 2022 Collection Schedule

Week of November 7: East Side + Cambridge (East)
Week of November 14: West Side + Woodward Heights
Week of November 21: East Side + Cambridge (East)
Week of November 28: West Side + Woodward Heights
Week of December 5: Final pickup begins starting with the
East Side and ends once all streets have been picked up



Leaf collection is a major task, as we generate more leaves per capita than any other nearby community. We ask for your cooperation to ensure that the process is as smooth and efficient as possible. The best thing you can do to help us is ensure that only leaves are placed at the curb, and that cars are not parked on the street during the day until the leaves are picked up during your pickup week. #### **Street Sweeping**

We will be conducting regularly scheduled street sweeping on the fourth Wednesday and Thursday. The west side will be swept on Wednesday, and the east side on Thursday.



We are asking residents to please remove all parked cars from the street on your street sweeping day to allow us to do as complete of a sweeping job as possible. Each car parked in the street requires the sweeper to pull away from the curb for a large distance, and can result in large segments of the street not being cleaned effectively.






