### **Upcoming events**

Youth Baseball, Youth Soccer and Swim Team Registration is underway. Due to EXTREME delays in equipment and uniform ordering times, all registration us moved up 4-8 weeks. Registration is going well. It's the 50<sup>th</sup> Year of the NSSL (the summer swim league that PR belongs to), so we will be helping the league celebrate that all season long!

Woodward Corners has offered to sponsor the 2022 Ice Cream Social on July 13<sup>th</sup> at the Pool. This is a cost saving of approx. \$1000 to the city.

The Pool and Gainsboro Pavilion will be rentable spaces this summer. We covered the pending rules and regulations for open fire at the Gainsboro Pavilion. Adding new rules, clarifying existing rules, adding hold harmless/waiver of liability to the contract. We will be working to revise the rules and getting them published by the beginning of March. These are beautiful spaces; we are excited to getting them used!

## **City commission report**

Commission Budnik spoke of the financial standing of the city. The city's goal is to have 70% of a year's revenue in a "slush" fund balance, the city is currently at 60% balance. Most large cities like to have 15% (2-3 months operating cost), we are working to have 7-8 months of operating cost for any emergency situations that could arise.

The CAC (Citizens Advisory Committee) will have a meeting at the PR Community Center on Tuesday, February 1<sup>st</sup> at 7pm. This is an opening public meeting. More information will be discussed of the Water Infrastructure project, and it's funding of the lead service line replacements and the federal mandates.

City Commission meetings are held the second Tuesdays of the month at City Hall at 7:30pm.

There are 3 open seats on the Planning Commission and 1 open seat on the Historical Commission. If you know anyone interested in applying, application are available online and due by March 31<sup>st</sup> to city hall.

In 2021 no guest passes were allowed to be used at the pool for the first few weeks to allow for staff training, etc.
